A compound field showing the relationships of this person to others in a household. Originally the relationship information for each person is held in the fields RELAT1 – RELAT5, RELPREV1, RELPREV2. Each person gives their relationship to all previous people on the form.

The Edit and Imputation system requires these fields to be held as a variable length array that allows for up to 30 people in a household. The system also requires reciprocal relationships to be held in the relationship array for each person. A reciprocal relationship is one that has not been given but is implied by a given relationship e.g. Person 2 gives a relationship to person 1. Therefore person 1's relationship to Person 2 is the reciprocal relationship that has to be worked out based on the relationship given by person 2.

In the 30 character array a single character represents a relationship to another person in the household who can be identified by position. The possible values at each position are :-
